Part A: Curriculum music

Where appropriate pupils in our KS5 classes will be assessed against the ASDAN Entry 1 Personal Progress Qualification for New Creative Activities, which includes the development and teaching of Music.

Students are taught Music in each strand and follow a bespoke curriculum tailored to their individual needs.

The main curriculum topics are linked to Charranga's SEND scheme and enable class staff to offer repetition for students whilst offering individual music experience.

Where appropriate individual students are funded for 1-1 sessions with a visiting music specialist.

Students within our complex need classes have weekly music therapy sessions to aid their development in music alongside their therapy needs.

We have a wide range of instruments that can be used in the lessons and our curriculum. Progress is evident through adult observation and photographs on our online learning journal, Tapestry.

Part B: Co-curricular music

The school provides the following co-curricular music provision to pupils:

- Individual 1-1 music sessions to identified pupils through PPG or LAC funding.
- Whole group music sessions to learn to play instruments.
- Nurture sessions for pupils LAC or Post LAC.
- Soundbeam small group sessions for a fully inclusive sensory and movement music experience
- Music experiences through Performing Arts lessons.
- Music experiences through sessions by outreach experts such as African Drumming to assist in the development of our British Values Theme Days.

Part C: Musical experiences

This academic year students will have the opportunity to take part in additional music activities alongside the curriculum such as:

- · Colourscape- visiting professionals.
- Visiting Percussion Resident musician for weeks residency.
- Termly themed music sessions linked to British Values- such as Africian Drumming.
- Whole School Productions for Christmas and end of Summer themed show.
- Autumn Festival and Christmas Festival at local church where students are offered the opportunity to play and/or share musical experiences.
- Weekly Jo Jingles sessions by an outside provider encouraging enjoyment in music and movement for identified pupils

In the future

We plan to continue to develop enjoyment around all aspects of music for our students. We will give them the individualised support and learning that they need to learn and experience music. We will continue to work with outside providers as well as Essex and Suffolk Music Services. We will strive to provide our children with more opportunities to enjoy music and develop a strong pupil voice. Furthermore, we will continue to provide our staff with training and updates to continue to develop their confidence and subject knowledge.
