

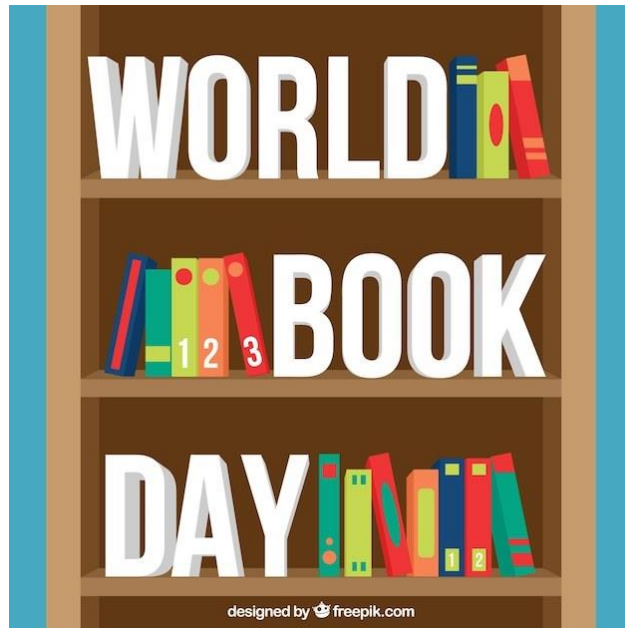

Sunshine 2 class - two pupils have built up confidence on the trampoline and another pupil has drawn a beautiful picture of a house, spider and a bird - please see below...

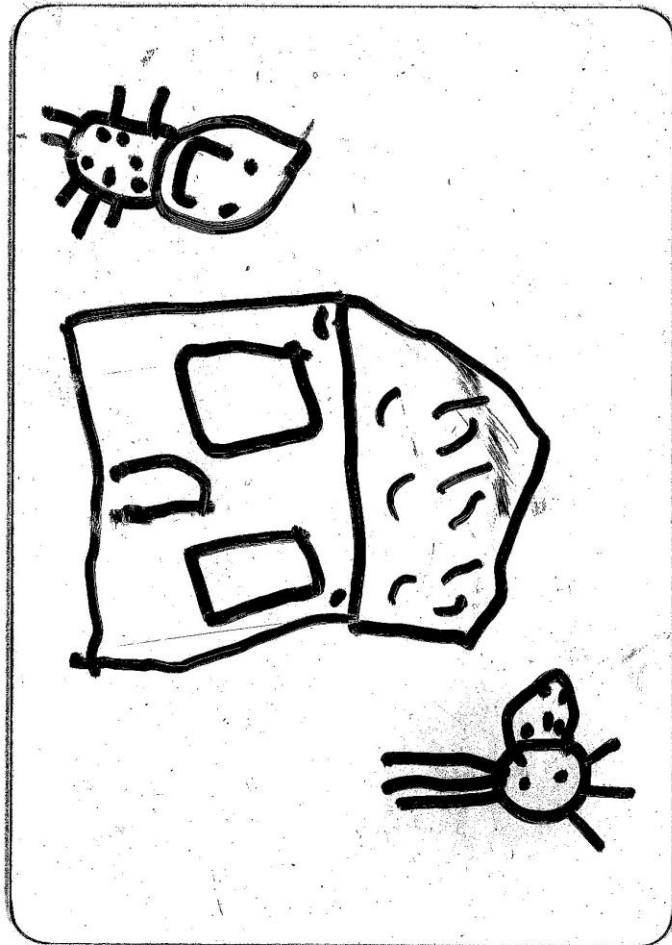
Sunshine 5 class - volleyball tournament this week and all had a great time.
