

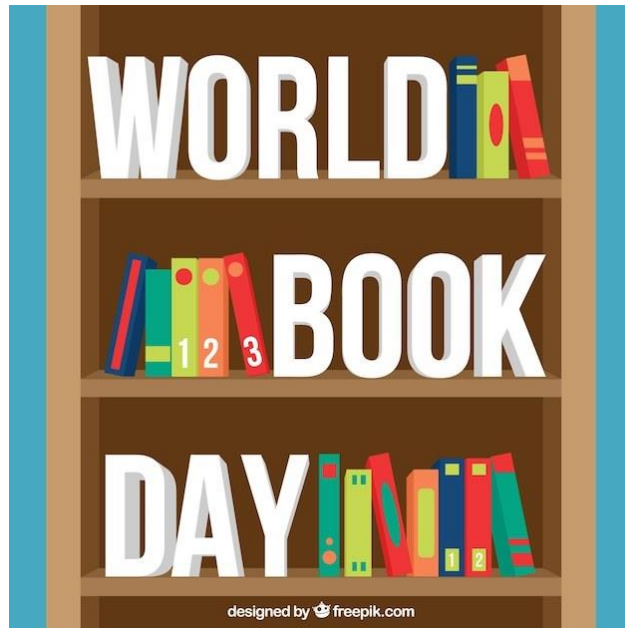

Beach 1 class - lovely communication in class, one student has used excellent verbal language with playing with the cars.

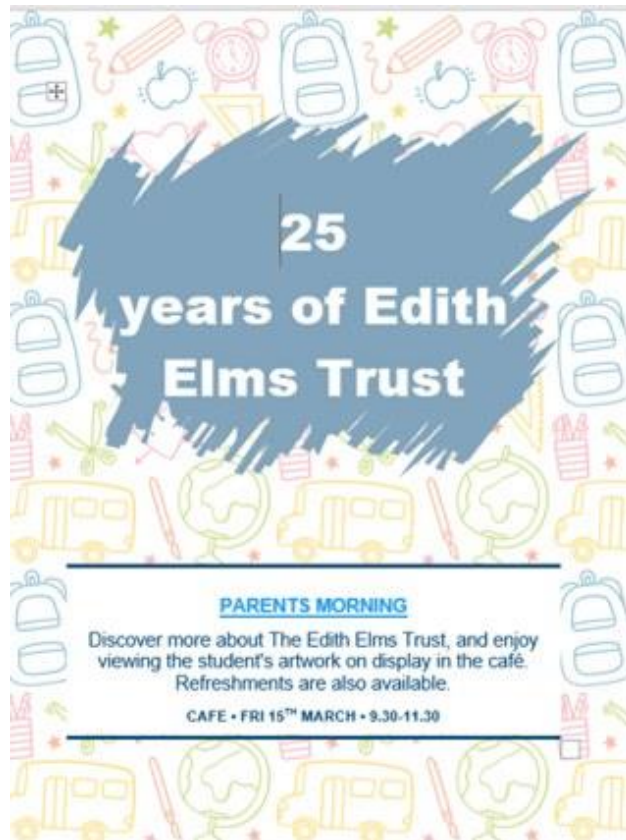
Beach 4 class - fantastic communication this week using the jungle core board and sensory tray core board.

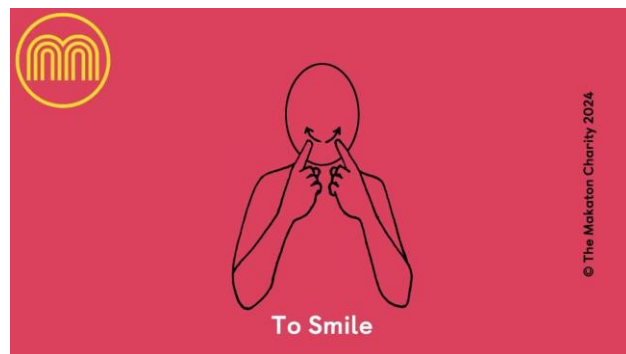
PE - a student engaged with PE this week, which they have not been able to access for a very long time. They did really well and engaged with the sensory circuits.

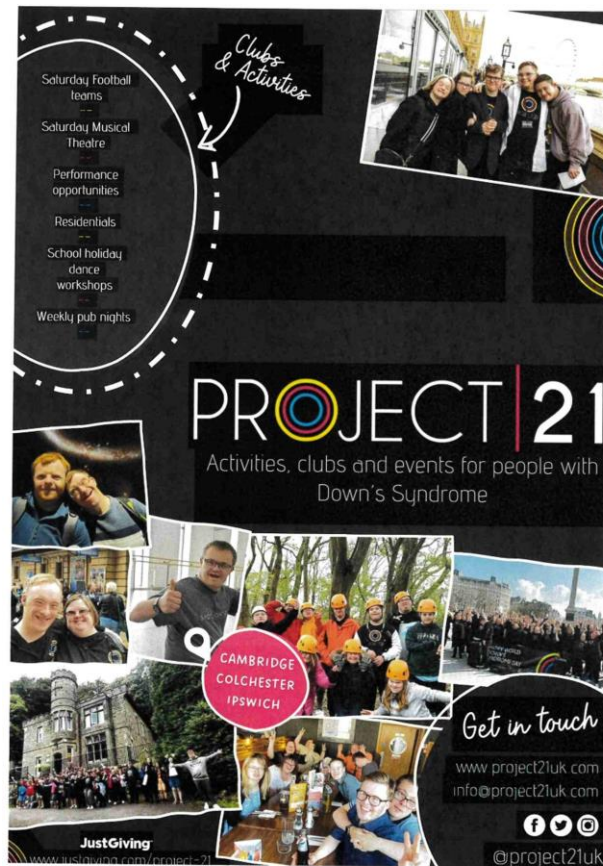
